The Embassy of Japan and JICA discuss Japan's economic contribution to Iraq with the Government of Iraq in Baghdad

- 22nd Monitoring Committee Meeting on Japanese ODA Projects -

On February 13, 2014, the Embassy of Japan in Iraq, Government of Iraq, and Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) held the Meeting of the 22nd Monitoring Committee on Japanese Official Development Assistance (ODA).

The Committee was co-chaired by H.E. Mr. Thamir Abbas Ghadhban, Chairman of the Prime Minister's Advisory Commission, and Mr. Kenichiro Matsubayashi, Minister-Counsellor of the Embassy of Japan in Iraq.

Participants from the Iraqi side at the Committee included high-ranking officials from the Ministries of Finance, Planning, Oil, Electricity, Transportation, Water Resources, Construction and Housing, Industry and Mineral, Municipalities and Public Works, Health, Communications, Kurdistan Regional Government, etc.

JICA officials including Mr. Shohei Hara, Chief Representative, JICA Iraq Office in Baghdad, also attended as well as officials of UNDP, Iraq, which acts as supporting unit to the M/C, provided its neutral observations and analysis through close monitoring of activities.

In addition to regular reviews and discussions on the implementation progress of 19 on-going projects amounting more than USD 4.1 billion, several participants reported results of the recent training programs in Japan and elsewhere. The Iraqi officials expressed their appreciations for the Japanese contributions to reconstruction of Iraq, and both sides agreed to continue forward-looking discussions on future cooperation in various fields including infrastructure, electricity, energy, water, etc.

The first Monitoring Committee was held in July 2008 with the aim of ensuring transparency, accountability and efficiency in project implementation. This was the 22nd meeting since then.

M/C is designed to be a significant platform where Iraqi and Japanese authorities confirm the quarterly progress of each project, identify any bottlenecks and discuss countermeasures as well as cross cutting issues across projects to accelerate the project implementation. M/C serves as the platform to ensure the transparency and accountability of project implementation.
