The Kuwait National Cleaning Company has won 207 billion IQD contract for three years to remove trash from Basra city. The company beat other competitors from Germany, Lebanon, Turkey and Iran. The Governor's advisor for services, Mohamad Jaafar said: "Basra's Governor Majed Al Nasrawi reiterated on numerous occasions the importance of dealing with the company according to standards of quality, timely delivery and cleanliness instead of the weight of garbage collected and buried in landfills. The latter approach has proven to be a failure when it was adopted with Gefra, the Turkish cleaning company in 2010. "The Kuwaiti company has agreed to employ many of the existing municipal workers in providing the service, with the remaining workers re-allocated to "public schools and certain sanitary centers".

(3) THALES: to provide Integrated Security System for the West Qurna-2 oil field in Iraq:

Thales has been awarded a contract to provide an Integrated Security System (ISS) for the West Qurna-2 oil field development located 65 km northwest of Basra in Southern Iraq. This contract has been signed with LUKOIL Mid-East Ltd, a subsidiary of the Russian oil company LUKOIL.

Thales will design and deploy the Integrated Security System over the security perimeter surrounding the West Qurna-2 area, protecting LUKOIL Mid-East personnel and assets, including well pads, central processing facilities, and gas treatment facilities, produced water treatment, all related off sites and utilities, storage tanks and living camps.

Thales's Integrated Security System will include a number of innovative technical solutions as well as a command & control center to assure supervision and control of day-to-day security operations and comprehensive protection from operational incidents and threats.

Thales is also part of the international consortium that was awarded another contract by LUKOIL Mid-East Ltd at the end of 2013 for spare parts supply and maintenance assistance at the existing and future security installations of LUKOIL's West Qurna-2 oil field development.

"These two contracts are important milestones because they are Thales's first deal with LUKOIL, In addition, these awards continue to confirm that Iraq is an important geographical market for Thales."

The chairman of Basra PC added that the PC passed many decisions in the field of supporting different activities such as sports, youths, grants and others projects) but the decisions were suspended because of the excuses of the governor which related to the lack of allocation for such projects .The Chairman of the PC elaborated that the projects which have been sent by the office of the governor got approval within 2 to 3 weeks by Basra PC while the decisions which have been taken by PC would not be implemented or take a long time for reviewing.

(1) Tribes Clash North of Basra

Heavy clashes broke out near Basra between two tribes, blocking off the city's route to the north and isolating the West Qurna-2 project which is operated by Lukoil .In al-Qurna district, north of Basra city, violent clashes erupted among the Bani Malik tribe, Karmasha, Bani Mansour, Albu Bekheit and the al-Farij tribes for different reasons.

The fighting led to 7 dead and 20 wounded, according to preliminary reports, as well as isolating Basra from the rest of the country. On the other side, Basra province's security apparatus did not intervene to stop the clashes because the policemen didn't have enough equipment to stop the fighting and most of the Iraqi army regiments moved to take part in the operation of Anti – terrorist in Al Anbar. This situation pushed Basra governor, Mr. Majid Al Nasrawi, to send an official letter to PM, Noori Al Maliki asked him to increase the number of security forces in the province because the tribal fighting might be out of the control and increase terrorists' attacks to Basra.

On the other hand, South-eastern of Basra remained free from major incidents and have continued to avoid mass-casualty by militant incursions. Most assaults are usually connected to personal disputes, illustrated in small arms attack which killed an individual near his home in Basra.

In addition to that, the security forces have tightened the security measure near the headquarters of Da'wa party and the State of Law Coalition whose head is the Prime Minister, Nouri al-Maliki, in Basra, Maysan, Thi-Qar and Muthanna provinces.

The main reason of the security measure is that the followers of Al Sadr organized demonstrations to denounce the statements launched by Maliki recently and Da'wa party office might be attacked.
