The deputy chairman of the BPC Waeeld Hameed Qaytan said that efforts which have been taken by Basra region advocates toward making Basra as an autonomous region required strong solidarity and supports. We as local government and personally have not hesitated to announce our support because their demand was in accordance with the Iraqi constitution not a trump card against the central government.

Qaytan announced his readiness to resend the previous petition of Basra as a region to the cabinet and he will personally work to collect 12 signatures of the BPC's members which is equivalent to 10% of voters to hold referendum. Qaytan pointed out that Basra is often considered as Iraq's lifeline, thanks to its rich oil wealth and other natural resources.

But, the province has fully marginalized and suffered from lack of services, environment problems and unemployment level which reached to 70-80%, Housing problems and the authorities which have recently granted by central Govt.to the local governments did not active. Qaytan is pessimistic because the prime minister, Hayder Ebadi respected constitution and laws which will lead finally to announce Basra as an autonomous region.

Basra provincial leaders claim rights to contract oil fields independently of the Oil Ministry

Provincial leaders and Basra PMs are threatening to seize authority over several oil fields were not invested by ICOs in Basra as a way to pay bills and fund investment in Basra. Last week in Istanbul, the chairman of the council's energy committee, Ali Shaddad al-Faris, held meetings with international lawyers to map out a legal strategy for claiming and contracting fields, according to an official familiar with the discussions. Moreover, on Nov 03,72 Khalaf Abdul-Samad, a member of the State of Law Coalition, said in a press statement made available to Anadolu that 72 members of parliament signed a petition to "restore Basra's rights" and end the discrimination exercised between the province and northern Iraq.

The petition demanded that Basra's quota be guaranteed in the budget in line with the agreed quotas. The MPs representing Basra in parliament "are the provinces legitimate representatives in negotiations with the government," he said, reminding the government of its obligation to pay Basra's financial dues, which have been outstanding since 2010. He called for a timetable to be drawn up for the government to repay its debts. If our demands are not met, we will export oil domestically and take all its revenues till the government repays all the money it owes Basra," he said Basra possesses the country's largest oil wells and produces 80 per cent of Iraq's oil.

Japan to extend tens of billions of yen in loans for Iraq water project

Japan is seeking to extend tens of billions of yen in new loans to Iraq for building a water purification plant in Samawah, the first large-scale aid offered by Tokyo to the southern Iraqi city in about seven years. The new assistance to the city, where Japanese troops were stationed from 2004 to 2006 to help rebuild the war-torn country, is expected to help Iraq improve infrastructure despite its financial difficulties due to the rising costs of fighting the Islamic State and a steep decline in oil prices, government sources said. The Japanese government plans to step up talks with the Iraqi government with the aim of reaching a broad agreement on the project by the end of March. The security situation in Samawah is stable and expected to remain so, whereas some projects funded by Japan's official development assistance in northern Iraq and other parts of the country have been effectively suspended due to advancing Islamic extremists, the sources said.

The last large-scale Japanese assistance offered to the city was a thermal power plant completed in 2008. Samawah, the capital of Muthanna province, remains less developed, and the sources say demand for a water treatment plant is high because it is the only provincial capital in the country with no full-fledged water purification facility. Under the plan, the plant is expected to use Japan's leading water filtration technology to treat salty water taken from the Euphrates River. The plant will be capable of supplying more than 100,000 tons of drinking water daily, benefiting some 300,000 people living in the Samawah area, the sources said.

Bride' tower in Basra to be 3,162 feet high –the tallest in the world

Basra is planning to build a monstrous tower which would dwarf even the Burj Khalifa in Dubai. The structure – called 'The Bride' – would be 3,162 feet tall, with 241 floors – the Burj Khalifa is a mere 2,722ft.Saudi Arabia's Kingdom Tower, due for completion in 2019, will also be higher than the Burj, although its exact final height is being kept secret. The Bride, though, is meant to be an antidote to super-tall towers, a 'vertical city' which would also require no electricity – drawing heat and power from the sun.Marcos De Andres, a director of AMBS Architects, who are working with Mott MacDonald consultancy on the project, said: 'In contrast to a conventional tower, The Bride will be a place that may be enjoyed by all, not only for the ones that live and work there, but also the rest of the public. 'Super tall towers are perceived as an object in the distance. An alien planted in the city, disconnected from the urban scale at ground level. 'The Bride, on the other hand, will be conceived as a city itself both vertically but also horizontally from the ground. 'It will be enjoyed by thousands of people in endless ways, within it, on it or under it. From walking in the vast shaded parks and promenades at ground level, to having lunch or shopping in a sky-square hundreds of metres above sea level.'

Bazooni added that gangs and militias would like Basra to go back to the era of 2005 and 2006. When militias completely controlled on all the activities of the ports. On other hand, Tribesmen attacked the director of Basra Investment Commission Ali Chaisb's house .Sources said that there was business's problem between the director and local investor which developed to utilize tribesmen to attack Chaisb's house .

For this reason, BPC has recently decided to host BSF's leaders to discuss the decline of the security level in Basra.

Further, the Inspector General of the Popular Mobilization Forces (PMF) for Basra Ammer Faris Ma'atuik said the units of PMF would be cooperated with BSF in field of sharing intelligence information and participating in implement of security plans which would be prepared by BOC in Basra.
